 - Other tropical diseases

 - o Help with reading glasses
 - Help with logistics



ITINERARY:

July 7 th	Arrive at Kotoka International Airport in Accra and travel 1 hour for an overnight stay at
	Asaasi Yaa Beach Resort on the beautiful Gulf of Guinea to refresh from travel, organize, and
	prepare.
July 8 th	Travel 2 hours to the village of Okurase and move in to your accommodations at Nkabom
	House. Take a tour of the village and participate in training for the VHO. All meals are local
	cuisine prepared by village women. Start learning the Twi language.
July 9th	Prepare supplies and organize for the Village Health Outreach (VHO). Participate in a formal
	village welcome and blessing by the Chief and Elders
July 10-14	VHO conducted directly in the village. All patients receive free care and free medicines.
July 15th	Patient follow-up, inventory of supplies, attend a party hosted by the Nkabom Children's
	Cultural Troupe.
July 16th	Interact with new friends, and learn African drumming.
July 17 th	Travel back to Asaasi Yaa and rest and relax by the ocean.
July 18th	After lunch travel to Accra to the Arts Centre for a bit of shopping. Then travel to the Kotoka
	airport for your overnight journey home.

Considerations:

Land Cost is \$1450: includes in country Facilitator, ground transportation, accommodations, meals and water, Twi Language Workshop, Drumming Workshop, guides, customary tips, and comprehensive Emergency Medical Insurance

Other Costs to consider: passport, Visa, airfare, transportation to/from your home airport, vaccines, anti-malaria medication, souvenirs
